03.24.02 Requests for Dispensations, Declarations of Interest, Gifts and Hospitality

03.24.03 Public Participation

Cllr Barry Wood referred to Cllr Simpson's report and highlighted the following:

- Hawkwell planning seems to be in a state of suspension awaiting consultations.
- The new local plan has just finished Regulation 18 consultation, the results of which will be analysed before the Regulation 19 consultation commences in 6 months time. This will be followed by a public examination.
- The Water Park development in Chesterton is not being pursued by Great Wolf due to unsatisfactory availability of water
- CW brought up the matter of the letter received by residents of Bucknell and copied into parish councillors from Ian Boll, Director of Communities, (CDC) on 31st August 2023 regarding the Firethorn development which was rude and insulting and contrary to GDPR regulations, Cllr Wood suggested that the PC emails him with the details, or registers an official complaint with CDC.

Cllr Nigel Simpson had submitted a written report which had been circulated prior to the meeting. .

03.24.08 Village matters

- a. Thames Water and village flood water –. 100 year ago Bucknell was the driest cleanest village around and now it is the worst local village with sewage and flooding. There was little or no flooding before the Valencia pipeline was installed. Letters have been received from residents complaining and the PC need to influence the powers that be to take action. It was suggested that Public Health, Environment Agency etc should be contacted with demands to remove the Valencia pipeline. County Council are responsible for storm water. AB will draft a broad general letter to be sent to Victoria Prentis, Environment Agency, Public Health with County Council as lead addressee.

03.24.09 Old Playing Field Lease – Cllr Alcock was not present for this discussion

Neil Wainmann was attending the meeting to advise on the sale of the land. His advice was that the land is intended to be used a open or recreational land which could cause problems if sold. The restrictive covenant could be terminated at short notice but this would not apply if the land is to be sold. In 1999 there was a question of the PC selling the land and a letter was written to OCC which was replied to by their agents asking if the county council wanted to retain the restrictions. The agents said that in the past the County Council had consented to the removal of the restriction providing the county council get 1/2 of the increase in value of the land there is also an issue as to whether Change of Use planning permission would be required. NW advised that the PC should seek formal legal advice. The small triangle of land by the gateway (ownership unknown) could also affect the sale of the land. Cridlands Estate Agent have provided an indicative valuation of the land. A letter has been written to the representatives of Stan's Land and a response is awaited. There was discussion as to whether instructing a solicitor for the sale of the land is good use of public money. It was agreed that Stan's representatives would be given until the end of March to respond after which AB will chase. After this time a decision will be made as to which path to take. The Deeds to the land are required, but the solicitors are no longer practicing. AB will draft a letter requesting the Deeds for the Clerk to send.

03.24.10 Highways

There are many speed indicators as an attempt to enforce the 20mph limit. Speeding vehicles and mobile phone users whilst driving are being reported to police. A meeting was arranged with highways regarding the roundabout which is being changed to traffic lights. Traffic speeding on Bainton Road is causing problems. Approx 7000 cars came through the village ad a result of an incident on the M40. Banbury Road in Bicester will be closed.

The site has been inspected by the Chief Exec with suggestions which includes a 'soft closure' of Bainton Road which could be done quickly to alleviate traffic issues.

Councillors are invited to attend 2-weekly meetings with traffic officers to provide feedback.

The volume of traffic has increased dramatically in the last 6 weeks.

Cllr Ford suggested signs on Bainton Road indicating access for residents only, or creating a one way system, or a weight restriction.

There was discussion about planters on the road and leaving wheely bins out to slow traffic down. Clerk to find out about wheely bin stickers.

CW to email CIIr Ford expressing concerns about the speed and volume of traffic which she will then escalate

Litter & Flytipping

JA reported that he regularly cleans up and collect many bags of rubbish and wanted to know how to stop people from littering. JA is willing to continue to

litterpick, but due to the nature of the debris is unwilling to sort it and therefore is charged to dispose of it at the tip. Clerk to pass on details of CDC Street cleansing to JA.
